

Twilight: The Dawn of Dusk

A trio exhibition by Alisya Fahmi, Faiz Mahdon, and Haziq Syawal

"I know not how it falls on me, This summer evening, hushed and lone; Yet the faint wind comes soothingly, With something of an olden tone

Forgive me if I've shunned so long Your gentle greeting, earth, and air! But sorrow withers even the strong And who can fight against despair?"

- "I know not how it falls on me" (1831), a poem by Emily Brontë.

From the golden hours of the evenings to the dusky moments of twilight, centuries of poets and artists alike have found meaning and inspiration in those last hours of light during the day. Before the era of smartphones and when internet addiction was a thing of fiction, evenings were for playtime under the sun for children. From badminton to football, riding bikes and roller skating, some of our best childhood memories were made outdoors. The twilight hours marked the moment when most of us would head home for dinner, and the sound of children's laughter would dance through the streets to their homes.

In her poem "I know not how it falls on me" (1831), Emily Brontë expresses a note of longing to be close to nature again after having strayed away from it; her grief and sorrow are piercingly evident in her desire to reconnect with a lost love. Almost two hundred years later, the distance between mankind's relationship with nature seems to have only grown farther apart.

Our days tend to grow hurried as we immerse ourselves in adulthood, only stopping when our heads hit the pillow at night. Distracted by our fast-paced lives, how many of us take the time to pause, and reunite with the earth? When did we last gaze at the sunset to marvel at the hues of pinks, blues, and oranges that make up the evening skies? "Twilight: The Dawn of Dusk" features the work of three young and emerging artists who have found common ground in reconnecting with nature.

Rooted in love for her hometown, Alisya Fahmi' documents the scenic views of the paddy fields of Kuala Nerang, Kedah during her evening walks when visiting home. Capturing the change of light from evening to dusk, she takes us on a walk through the paddy fields in her latest series of paintings entitled "Senjakala".

Through fictional landscapes inspired by the comfort and calmness he finds within nature, Faiz Mahdon gives us a peek into his quiet but content little world in his latest body of work entitled "MINDtalk". Embraced with a sense of tranquillity, his landscapes move from merely still paintings in his room, to the great outdoors; - perhaps symbolic of his growing relationship with nature.

In an unconventional take on landscape compositions, Haziq Syawal presents "Dusk and Night", a series of paintings that observes the picturesque vistas of Perak. Painted in monochromatic hues of orange and grey, he invites us to experience the intricacies of the evening light from his perspective.

In their own visual language, Alisya Fahmi, Faiz Mahdon, and Haziq Syawal have each turned to their paintbrushes to share these contemplations and observations of landscapes. Some are recalled from memories and references, and others are reconstructed from imagination. From the early evenings that greet us to the shadows of dusks, we are made privy to their keen reflections of those precious hours from their eyes.

Alisya Fahmi: Senjakala

While Alisya Fahmi may be relatively new to the art scene, she has certainly done well to plant her foot firmly at the doors of our local galleries. Having sold out during her first solo exhibition, "Kaseh", with Artas Galeri several months ago, her quick return to the studio has resulted in a fresh body of work. However, instead of her usual figurative paintings that tug at our heartstrings, we see Alisya venture into unfamiliar territory in her latest landscape series entitled "Senjakala". This exhibition marks the artist's attempt to break away from her comfort zone in terms of both composition and subject matter.

That said, her fondness for the classic themes of culture, tradition, and home remains. Inspired by the scenic views of paddy fields at her hometown, Kuala Nerang, Kedah, we are met with six vivid landscapes of fields that stretch far beyond mountains, with skies that range from calm pastels to a fiery clash of blues and oranges. While the figurative elements that we associate with her practice are nowhere to be found, she has left traces of human life within these spaces. Be it the boots or tools belonging to the paddy field workers, or solitary man-made structures, we are reminded of the labour of agricultural roles that we do not see much of in urban cities like Kuala Lumpur.

However, the beauty of Alisya's work is that her depiction of human life is merely an echo in contrast to the greatness of nature. In a time where industrialisation is not slowing down despite its impact on climate change, it is invigorating to see nature in its rightfully dominant place. It provides, but reigns in all its glory.

Faiz Mahdon: MINDtalk

Faiz Mahdon's immaculate, dreamlike landscapes may feel foreign, as though they are from a distant land. But while they are not local to Malaysia, they are closer to us than we would think, existing within the mind of the artist himself. More fondly known as Fafa, the development of the unique style of this emerging artist can be credited to the two years he spent working at MAPS Perak (Movie Animations Park Studios), where his imagination and ideas were professionally honed.

The series "MINDtalk" depicts fictional, surrealist landscapes that are akin to something out of an Enid Blyton storybook. In the adventures many of us took while reading novels of mysteries and fairytales, the landscapes of our minds were built on the bricks of imagination, curiosity, and dreams. However, being an emotionally attuned individual, Fafa has constructed an imaginary world not from stories, but from the building blocks of his memories and identity.

As an introvert, words have always been something he struggles with; but as an artist, his subjects are rich with symbolism reflective of his struggle with identity and gender dysphoria, among other things. He is someone who enjoys being in his own company, something which not many of us are able to appreciate. To allow yourself space to be on your own, without actually being alone in this world can be a comforting feeling - and the essence of this is captured through Fafa's paintings. His landscapes, though quiet and away from the busyness of the world, are not completely devoid of human life. Instead of being overwhelmed with material things and surface relationships, he is selective with who and what he invites into his world. In this respect, Fafa shows us there is peace away from excess, and less is sometimes more

Haziq Syawal: Dusk and Night

With geometrical planes that overlap across his paintings and a colour palette that appears to decrease in saturation, one would recognise Haziq Syawal's current signature style from a mile away. Having had his last solo exhibition just under a year ago with Segaris Art Center, many of us would recall his expansive paintings comprising painted snapshots of figurative, landscapes, and still life elements.

In his latest body of work entitled "Dusk and Night", Haziq opted to engage with the subject of landscape through unconventional means. He plays with space and perspective by deconstructing the foundation of planes that make up a landscape composition: the foreground, middleground, and background. Rearranging these fragmented layers, his paintings become a montage of imagery rather than the traditional landscape.

The landscapes that feature in this series are taken from his frequent visits to Perak where his mother-in-law resides. Drawn to the change of light between the evenings to nighttime, he captures the scenic views from the lens of a colour-blind artist. Hence, through hues of orange and grey, Haziq shares a piece of his world with us. In his keen observation of these golden hours to nightfall,he invites us to slow down and pay attention to the moments we let slip through our fingers.


